

IICA Training - new Course in Pyrometric Requirements for Thermal Processing

A new course titled 'Course in Pyrometric Requirements for Thermal Processing' has just been developed in Australia.

A considerable amount of time has been spent by the IICA (in excess of four years) to finally get to the stage of being able to present the course, in conjunction with RMIT, in the 2nd half of 2015.

This Course will provide the opportunity for Australia's aerospace industry to implement the relevant International Standards and become eligible for engagement with the global aerospace maintenance and supply chain.

Compliance with International Standards, such as AMS 2750, is a prerequisite for international business for contracts for certain areas of aircraft maintenance, refits, servicing and supply activities with global aircraft manufacturers.

An Online National Networking Directory of Graduates will be provided by the IICA, the Industry national peak body. Course graduates will be eligible for listing on the Directory which will ensure Industry access to complying companies and individuals. End users, suppliers and service providers will minimise their risk by ensuring that their supply chain is listed on the IICA Directory.
